From a young age while tending to the garden, doing farm chores and learning to hunt and fish, he grew a passion for horticulture, fell in love with cows, and became a steward of the land around him. Before and during college, he spent two summers in Alaska working on a small scale organic vegetable farm assisting the owner in all aspects from seed to sale. Niles graduated from the University of Wisconsin - La Crosse in 2013 with a Bachelor of Science in Recreation Resource Management. Upon graduation he headed East to Vermont where he found his first true calling at a non-profit, agriculture and dairy education program - Farms for City Kids Foundation at Spring Brook Farm in Reading, Vermont.

For seven years, Niles educated thousands of inner city youth from New York City, Boston, Philadelphia, Atlanta, and Chicago about dairy farming, sustainable agriculture, and the natural world. 2022 Planting a Wrap

Planting began on May 11th and successfully finished on June 6th. Approximately 65 acres was cut by hand and planted this Spring, the balance planted are minitubers. This is a large effort of many people from the cutting room, warehouse to planting crew, we thank them for their hard work and commitment.

The entire crop is hilled and sprayed with pre-emergent herbicide. We are using a hiller that was put together by Jeff Suchon at Bushman's Riverside Ranch and it is working well. About half of the crop is emerged as of June 8th. Second hilling and side-dress will begin very soon. We have a good crew of staff going into summer. The irrigation is getting set-up and we are looking ahead to plant our winter wheat in two row skips.

Due to problems with production, greenhouse 4 was shut down at the beginning of picking during March. This will pose a challenge to production amounts, mentioned in part in an earlier letter from Brooke Babler. We have reached out to Sklarczyk Seed Farm again in Michigan to make up for lost production. On a very positive note, greenhouses 1, 2, and three are all growing well and thrips and TSWV are under control. We are beginning to prepare right now for planting the fall crop of greenhouse 4 and feel the greenhouse production issues that the farm faced in late winter are now behind us.

Due to the decline in box quality in 2018-2020, a higher amount of the large seed pallet boxes will need to be replaced. We switched vendors in 2021 and the new boxes from northern Michigan are working good.
